CAFCE INDUCTED INTO THE UNIVERSITY OF CINCINNATI CO-OPERATIVE EDUCATION HALL OF HONOR

Toronto, ON, February 1, 2012 – The Canadian Association for Co-operative Education (CAFCE) has another commendation to its name; the organization has been inducted into the University of Cincinnati's Co-operative Education Hall of Honor.

The Hall of Honor recognizes organizations and individuals that have made a significant qualitative difference in the advancement of co-operative education (co-op); CAFCE will be recognized at a luncheon that will pay tribute to recipients on Thursday, February 16 at the University of Cincinnati campus.

CAFCE was founded in 1973 as the voice of post-secondary co-op and experiential learning in Canada. The association has created a National standard for co-op programs and evaluates participating post-secondary institutions for CAFCE accreditation purposes. Members include professional co-op and career development practitioners who provide quality co-op programming to over 80,000 Canadian post-secondary students each year. CAFCE members are also active supporters and participants in National and International associations such as CEIA, ASET, ACEN and WACE.

The University of Cincinnati established the Hall of Honor in celebration of the 100th anniversary of Dean Herman Schneider's founding of the cooperative system of education.
